Complete your studies at one of the few schools in the United States to offer a Doctor of Juridical Science (S.J.D.) degree. KU Law's S.J.D. program is designed for students who are interested in deep legal research and writing. Graduates go on to careers as senior public officials or legal scholars. Candidates must hold either a basic law degree (LL.B.) and a master's in law (LL.M.), or a J.D. from an ABA-accredited law school.

Program Outline

First Year (16 credits):

- 6 credit hours of coursework in fall/spring
- S.J.D. First-Year Seminar
- Begin work on S.J.D. dissertation

Second Year (4 credits):

- Advanced S.J.D. Seminar in fall/spring
- Continue to research and write dissertation

Third Year (2 credits):

- Complete S.J.D. dissertation
- Present dissertation to committee

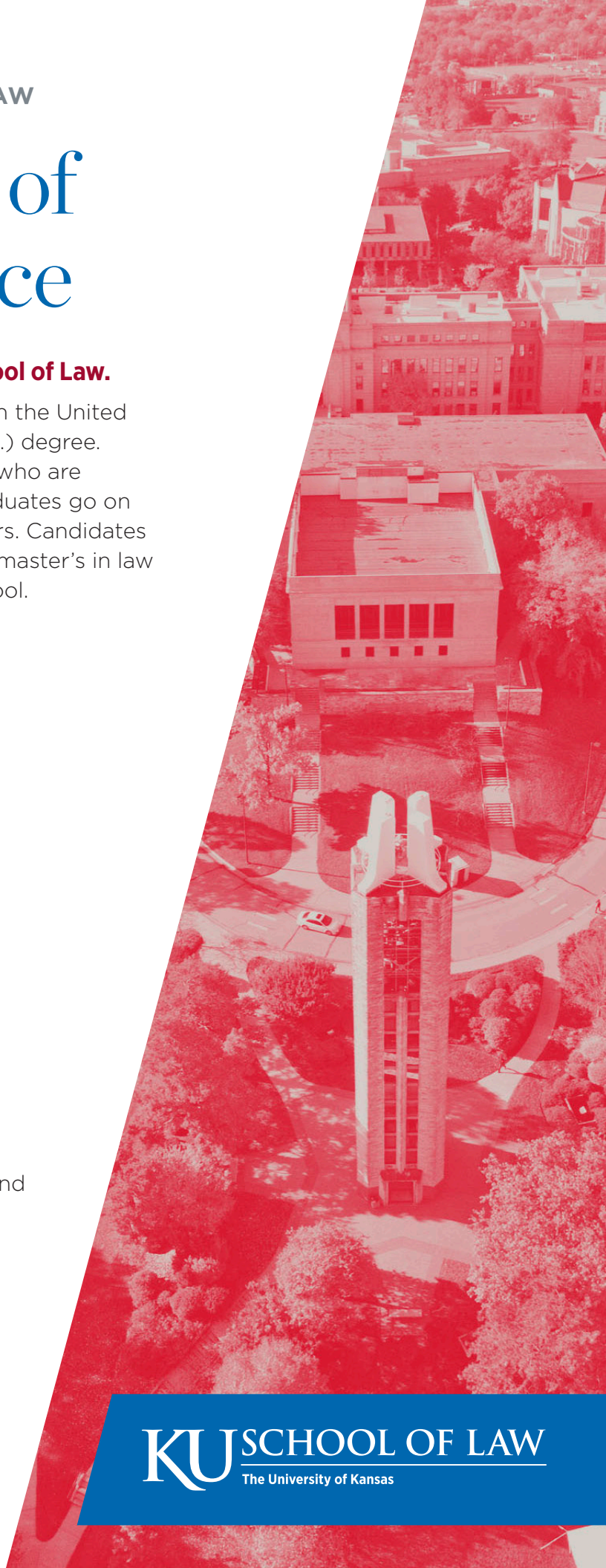

WHY KU LAW: S.J.D. HIGHLIGHTS

FACULTY CONNECTION

The S.J.D. cohort at KU Law is small, which means the program can be designed specifically to meet students' needs. Each candidate is assigned a faculty advisor who helps guide the process of researching and writing a dissertation. First-year candidates enroll in an S.J.D. Seminar course that provides an introduction to the American legal system and academic writing. During a second-year Advanced S.J.D. Seminar, students conduct research and writing for their dissertations.

INTERNATIONAL RECOGNITION

The KU School of Law is an integral part of the University of Kansas, the state's flagship research institution. KU belongs to the prestigious Association of American Universities (AAU), a group of 62 American and Canadian schools that represent the highest levels of higher education. Other AAU members include Harvard, Stanford, UC-Berkeley and MIT.

Personalized Academic Advising

Each S.J.D. candidate is assigned a faculty committee chair when they're admitted.

One-to-One Career Coaching

International students at KU Law enjoy full access to the law school's Career Services Office. The office helps connect students to training, resources and knowledge to help them advance their legal careers. Additionally, S.J.D. students receive faculty guidance on topics including teaching, researching and publishing.

KU International Support Services
