- Founded a new area of legal study and education, called Native American Peacemaking, based on traditional indigenous dispute resolution, transformative theory, and tribal techniques.
- Developed and designed cutting-edge curriculum for translating indigenous practices into a law school setting while retaining cultural authenticity. Shared the curriculum and techniques with other law professors who then launched classes at several other law schools.
- Developed and crafted the ethical model standards for indigenous communities conducting peacemaking.
- Designed clinical practicum for students to work with indigenous leaders on the ground in indigenous communities including supervising research and systems design projects, drafting legal code, conducting complex community dispute facilitation training, and conducting skills training modules.
- Designed Advanced Mediation Clinic curriculum and model to provide students with advanced clinical pedagogy, systems design skills, project management skills, team leadership and supervision skills, and partner and client interaction and management skills.
- Created Pro Bono Scholars Program to provide free direct supervised student legal services to government agency employees experiencing discrimination in the workplace. Students received a full semester of legal academic credit for their service.
- Teach clinical course in mediation incorporating mediation theory, research, statutes, and model standards.
- Ten consecutive semesters of full or overloaded course and supervision, teaching at least seven clinical credit hours and as many as nineteen clinical credits per semester.
- Winner of the Parker School of Foreign and Comparative Law Global Innovation Award for pioneering international peace summits to train ambassadors in peace dialogue skills and practice.
