

Summer Judicial Field Placement Program

Please read this carefully before applying for the Judicial Field Placement program. It explains the commitments you must make if you are selected to participate in the program.

Applications for the summer and fall-spring programs are evaluated at the same time. You must submit your application packet to Glenn Jewell, the Judicial Field Placement Director (the "Director") by emailing it to Janette Roundy at <u>janetteroundy@ku.edu</u> by 5 p.m. on the second Monday of February (in the spring semester BEFORE the internship begins). Your application packet must contain:

- (1) the application form, which you must fill out completely and which is attached here;
- (2) your resume; and
- (3) your unofficial law school transcript.

The Director will review these documents, as will the judges (and their full-time law clerks) participating in the program. By submitting an application for the program, you are consenting to review of the information you provide and indicating your understanding of the requirements set out below and your intent to abide by them. If you accept another position for the summer and are no longer available to intern for a judge, <u>you must inform us as soon as possible. This will assist us in the</u> <u>placement process</u>.

Students must enroll in the program in both summer sessions. You may not drop the course without the Director's permission and that of the judge to whom you have been assigned.

Students (graded credit/no credit) will receive three credit hours each summer session. Only students who will have completed at least two regular semesters of law school, but no more than two semesters and two summer sessions, by the start of their internship, are eligible for the program.

Students must work with assigned judges no less than 24 and no more than 40 hours each week of the two summer sessions (a total of 255 hours for the whole summer.) You must attend an orientation session, <u>in person</u>, and meet individually with the Director at least once during the summer. You must complete weekly assignments, attend virtual class sessions, complete related online coursework, submit a 1-2 page journal of your activities each week, and complete a 5-6 page paper related to your experience in the program.

Students participating in the Judicial Field Placement program will be held to the same standards as employees of the court.

- You must not work for a lawyer, law firm, public interest organization, or governmental agency while you are enrolled in the program.
- Students must not enroll concurrently in the program and another law school clinic or field placement.
- While participating in the program, students may be prohibited from participating in partian political activity.
- You must disclose to the Director and the assigned judge any potential conflicts of interest, including other legal employment, whether paid or unpaid.
- You must disclose on your application for the program any prior criminal convictions or honor code charges.
- You must disclose to the Director and the assigned judge any criminal convictions, arrests, or honor code charges that occur while enrolled in the program.
- Failure to disclose arrests, convictions, or honor code charges may result in termination from the program.
- Before starting your internship, you may need to disclose your social security number, date of birth, and race to your assigned court for a background check. You may also be required to submit to a fingerprint check upon starting your internship.
