<u>New York</u>

- "Hateful Conduct Law," <u>N.Y. Gen. Bus. Law § 394-ccc</u>
- *Volokh v. James*, No. 22-CV-10195, 2023 WL 1991435, at *1 (S.D.N.Y. Feb. 14, 2023) (granting motion for preliminary injunction enjoining the enforcement of § 394-ccc) (appeal pending).

<u>California</u>

- Cal. Bus. & Prof. Code §§ 22675-22681 (<u>AB 587</u>) (effective January 1, 2023): <u>Requires</u> social media companies to publicly post their content moderation policies and semiannually report data on their enforcement of the policies to the attorney general.
- The California Age Appropriate Design Code Act (<u>AB 2273</u>) (signed September 15, 2022) (not yet effective): Imposes obligations on businesses that provide online services, including age authentication and disclosure requirements,.
 - o Motion for Preliminary Injunction, No. 22-cv-08861 (February 17, 2023).
- California <u>SB 287</u> (introduced on 2/2/23): Permits civil liability against social media companies for using algorithms that encourage children to engage in harmful conduct.

<u>TikTok</u>

- Nearly half of the <u>states</u> and many <u>public Universities</u> have banned TikTok.
- On December 29, 2022, President Biden signed the No TikTok on Government Devices Act (<u>S. 3455</u>).

- The Senate <u>introduced</u> the Restricting the Emergence of Security Threats that Risk Information and Communications Technology Act (<u>RESTRICT Act</u>). President Joe Biden <u>endorsed</u> the legislation on March 7, 2023.
- The House (<u>HR 1153</u>) <u>introduced</u> the Deterring America's Technological Adversaries Act (DATA ACT).
 - In a <u>letter</u> to Rep. Michael McCaul, the Chairman of the House Committee on Foreign Affairs, the ACLU wrote that the bill "would violate the First Amendment rights of millions of Americans who use TikTok to communicate, gather information, and express themselves daily."
